Pope Francis is memorable for several key reasons that set him apart from many of his predecessors:

#### 1. Firsts:

He was the **first pope from the Americas** (Argentina), the **first Jesuit pope**, and the **first to take the name Francis**, after St. Francis of Assisi, symbolizing humility and concern for the poor.

### 2. Focus on Humility and Simplicity:

He rejected many traditional luxuries of the papacy (e.g., living in the Apostolic Palace) and emphasized living simply, aligning himself with the marginalized and poor.

### 3. **Progressive Tone**:

While upholding Church doctrine, he adopted a more **pastoral and inclusive tone** on sensitive issues like homosexuality, divorce, and interfaith dialogue.

### 4. Environmental Advocacy:

He became a **global voice on climate change** with his 2015 encyclical *Laudato Si'*, *calling for urgent action to care for "our common home."* 

#### 5. Global Diplomacy and Peace Efforts:

Pope Francis played a role in key diplomatic events, including helping to restore relations between the **U.S. and Cuba**, and consistently called for peace in conflict zones.

#### 6. Accessibility and Charisma:

He was known for his **warmth**, **personal gestures**, and **willingness to engage directly** with ordinary people — often hugging the sick, visiting prisons, and washing the feet of refugees.

# **Respectful Relationships**



Respectful Relationships education is a core component of the Victorian Curriculum from foundation to year 12. It is all about embedding a culture of respect and equality across the entire school community.

In Term 2, social and emotional learning across Prep to Year 6 includes a focus on either positive coping or problem solving.

### **Topic 3: Positive Coping**

In this topic, students explore different coping strategies and talk about them. By learning the language of coping, they are more likely to understand and use helpful strategies, while reducing unhelpful ones. They also get to reflect on their own coping choices and learn new options.

Students are introduced to self-talk and practice using positive self-talk to handle tough situations. This helps them manage negative thoughts and feelings, and encourages persistence. Positive self-talk is a skill that can be learned and improved with practice.

### **Topic 4: Problem Solving**

Problem-solving skills are an important part of the coping repertoire. The classroom program provides a number of learning activities to develop students' problem-solving skills. The activities in the program assist students to develop their critical and creative thinking skills, and to apply them to scenarios exploring personal, social and ethical dilemmas.
