


CLASSROOM PLACEMENTS FOR 2025



St Carlo Acutis Our First Millennial Saint

Carlo Acutis (1991–2006) was an Italian teen known as the "Apostle of the Eucharist" and the "first millennial saint" for his deep Catholic faith, his passion for the Eucharist, and his innovative use of technology to evangelize. Born in London but raised in Milan, he became a devout Catholic from a young age, inspiring his parents back to faith. He used his computer skills to create websites documenting Eucharistic miracles, an effort Pope Francis later hailed as an example for young people in the digital age. After a battle with leukemia, he died at age 15, leaving a legacy of holiness and faith that continues to inspire millions.

Early Life and Faith

- **Born in London**: Carlo was born in London, England, on May 3, 1991, to Italian parents.
- **Devotion to God**: At a young age, he developed a deep love for God and the Catholic faith, a passion that inspired his non-religious parents to return to church.
- **First Communion**: He received his First Communion at age seven and was known for his profound devotion to the Eucharist, calling it his "highway to heaven".

Digital Ministry and Innovation

- "God's Influencer": Carlo used his strong computer and web design skills to promote Catholic devotion and evangelize.
- **Eucharistic Miracles Website**: He created a widely recognized website that documented Eucharistic miracles from throughout history.
- **Technology for Good**: He viewed technology and the internet as powerful tools for spreading the Gospel and for good, transforming them into channels for faith.

Canonization and Legacy

- Death from Leukemia: Carlo died of acute promyelocytic leukemia at age 15 on October 12, 2006.
- **Beatification and Canonization**: He was beatified in 2020 and canonized in 2025, becoming the first millennial saint in the Catholic Church.
- Inspiration to Youth: His life is a testament to how young people can live
 a life of holiness and devotion, using their talents to serve God and the
 Church in the modern world.
