Exhibition marks half a century

St Peter Apostle Primary School is celebrating 50 years in Hoppers Crossing with a golden jubilee exhibition running until the end of this week.

Past students, staff members and members of the public are invited to view the exhibition which principal Karen Wilson said marked a significant milestone.

"It's important to celebrate our story and our history and to recognise the contribution that the parish has made to our school since they started it 50 years ago."

On display are a variety of memorabilia and artefacts as well as some famous alumni.

"It has all of the photos, trophies, sporting recognitions and interviews with past students including exbulldogs star Brad Johnson," said Ms Wilson who added that among the ex-pupils who had returned for the exhibition were those involved in marking the school's quarter-century in 1998.

"We also had a time capsule which was created on the 25th anniversary and as part of our celebrations we opened that and invited back the school leaders who wrote letters in that time capsule," she said.

"A lot of their reflections were on what life at St Peters would be like now and they were excited about how many had come true."

Ms Wilson said the school's current students were doing the same thing.

"We're really excited to make our own time capsule now and showcase what our school is like for students in the future to see"

The exhibition is in the St Peter Apostle school hall and is free of charge and open to the public. It closes at 5pm on Thursday, June 22.




'St Peter's Got Talent' Talent Show

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. SCHOOL FEES - 2023

In 2023 the school will be changing the way it structures its Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program in response to the changing needs of the students and best practice for the school in moving forward. At the moment, families are asked to purchase devices for their children upfront in Grade 3 so that these can be used at school. Moving forward, the school will be using a leasing model which allows families to pay devices off while the student is at school from Grades 3 to Grade 6. To facilitate this we will be introducing an ICT levy in school fees that will cover the cost of the device over the four years. This levy will cover costs, including a carry case and the student will own the device when they graduate in Grade 6.

If your family is eligible for the Reduced Fees Policy and you have been approved through the formal approval process, then the ICT levy will be included in the discount fees offered.

The benefits of this new program are as follows:

- Every Grade 3 child will have a device to use at school
- The device will be owned by the student
- The device does not need to be fully paid for at the start of Grade 3

The new ICT levy will start in Grade 3 next year only, as higher grades will still be part of the previous BYOD Program. In 2024 the levy will be extended to Grades 3 and 4.




