

### **Author Visit - Sue DeGennaro**

On Tuesday 25th August, we were visited by Sue DeGennaro. Sue is a local author/illustrator. When working with our Junior grades, she told a story and then showed them how to draw some of her characters. For the older children, she discussed the long process of writing and publishing a book before she showed them the art of illustration. She was amazing with the children and shared her genuine love of literacy with everyone. Whether it was listening to tales of adventure or learning the art of illustration, a great time was had by all.















### Recount – The importance of talking about your day

Talking with children is important because it builds your child's language and communication skills. By creating opportunities for your child to re-tell stories you can support your child's understanding of how stories work. This is a great way to support early literacy skills and will help with reading comprehension and their development of simple sentence construction.

When you go on an outing or holiday with your child take a few photos of things happening around you. For example, during a trip to the farm, take photos as your child feeds the animals, goes on a ride, or eats lunch. Later, look at the photos together and use them to help guide your child to recount what happened at the farm. By placing the pictures in a sequence, it opens an opportunity for you to support your child's understanding of sequence and related vocabulary such as 'first', 'next', and 'last'. Get your child to conclude with an "closing statement" such as "when we go back, we looked at the pictures and..." or "I really liked going to the farm because...."

Encourage your child to include who is the picture, what they are doing and where they are.

You could create your own personalised book as a fun and personal way to enhance your child's language skills.

### **SCHOOL FEES - 2023**

In 2023 the school will be changing the way it structures its Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program in response to the changing needs of the students and best practice for the school in moving forward. At the moment, families are asked to purchase devices for their children upfront in Grade 3 so that these can be used at school. Moving forward, the school will be using a leasing model which allows families to pay devices off while the student is at school from Grades 3 to Grade 6. To facilitate this we will be introducing an ICT levy in school fees that will cover the cost of the device over the four years. This levy will cover costs, including a carry case and the student will own the device when they graduate in Grade 6.

If your family is eligible for the Reduced Fees Policy and you have been approved through the formal approval process, then the ICT levy will be included in the discount fees offered.

The benefits of this new program are as follows:

- Every Grade 3 child will have a device to use at school
- · The device will be owned by the student
- The device does not need to be fully paid for at the start of Grade 3

The new ICT levy will start in Grade 3 next year only, as higher grades will still be part of the previous BYOD Program. In 2024 the levy will be extended to Grades 3 and 4.


